Singer Celine Dion has opened up about her health problems, revealing she has a disorder called Stiff Person Syndrome.

In a video posted to her Instagram page on December 8, Dion explained she had recently been diagnosed with the disorder.

"We now know this is what's been causing all of the spasms that I've been having," the 54-year-old said.

"Unfortunately, these spasms affect every aspect of my daily life, sometimes causing difficulties when I walk and not allowing me to use my vocal cords to sing the way I'm used to.

"I'm working hard with my sports medicine therapist every day to build back my strength and my ability to perform again, but I have to admit it's been a struggle."

What is Stiff Person Syndrome?

Researchers have described Stiff Person Sydnrome as a neurological disorder which also has the features of an autoimmune disease.

It causes muscle stiffness in a person's torso and limbs, and also a heightened sensitivity to noise, touch, and stress.

These factors can set off painful muscle spasms.

The disorder is considered to be very rare, affecting one or two people in a million, with women more likely to have the disorder than men.

It's a "very serious condition," Desimir Mijatovic, a pain medicine specialist with the Cleveland Clinic in Ohio, told TODAY.com.

"People can have difficulty with movement and

difficulty with living their lives."

Mijatovic said there are many muscles involved in singing, especially in front of a large audience. "Those muscles are prone to spasm, or tightening

up, and I'm sure it can affect the way that she sings and performs," Mijatovic said.

"If those muscles aren't working properly, that can make it very difficult."

Scott Newsome, director of the Stiff Person Syndrome Centre at Johns Hopkins Medicine in the US, called it "a devastating disease."

Judith Lucy's shock personal announcement: 'I just can't do it anymore'

Well-known Australian entertainer Judith Lucy has announced she's giving up the thing that made her a household name: her career in stand-up comedy.

The 54-year-old comedy icon announced she would be no longer be doing stand-up after realising she just "wasn't very happy."

Lucy has been a stalwart of the Australian comedy scene for more than 30 years, but in a piece written for the ABC, she admitted the COVID pandemic made her take stock of her life.

"I came to understand that the angst I was experiencing due to the pandemic was not that different to how I felt most of the time," she wrote.

"For years I'd beaten myself up about the habits I'd used to numb myself, whether it was drinking, smoking, dope or watching hours of mindless TV.

"But I'd never asked myself why I did those things.

"The answer was to cope with the anxiety of my job.

"I could turn off for a few hours and then get up and do it all again.

"I came to view living like this as normal."

Lucy said she went "completely crazy" during lockdown - and then realised she'd had enough of that part of her life.

"No-one was holding a gun to my head," she wrote, referring to her long stand-up career.

"But it's taken me nearly 35 years to realise that I can just ... stop."

The comedian admitted that making the decision hadn't been easy, because comedy had given her "friends, community, travel, adventures, sex, a public profile and let's not forget, money."

But she added that she was looking forward to living her life in a way that didn't involve "dying to get to the end of something, or doing whatever it takes to turn off."

Lucy noted that she wasn't completely retiring and would continue to write and perform - just not in a stand-up capacity.

But she added an important disclaimer.

"If I'm unemployed in a couple of years then everything you've just read is completely untrue," she wrote.

In her final episode of the Judith Lucy - Overwhelmed and Living podcast, she said she realised being a stand-up comedian probably wasn't quite as difficult as many other jobs.

"I know, it's not like I'm working in an Amazon factory, I should just get over myself," she said.

"But I've lurched from one job, show, gig, to the next, and I just don't want to live like that anymore."

She said parents also love that the show encourages having a 'tactical wee' which means going to the bathroom 'just in case'.


'The advice changed their lives. Brilliant, I love it,' she said.

Developed in partnership with Walker Corporation, the University's newest vertical campus will drive economic growth and open higher education and employment opportunities for Australia's fastest-growing region.







Argentina win incredible World Cup final in shootout penalties

Lionel Messi finally achieved his World Cup dream as Argentina won their third crown on penalties in one of the greatest finals in the tournament's history.

Argentina won the shootout 4-2 after a spectacular game which developed into the muchanticipated confrontation between the 35-yearold maestro Messi and his France opposite number Kylian Mbappe.

France's own superstar scored a hat-trick - the first in a Fifa World Cup final since 1966 - but still ended up on the losing side at Lusail Stadium.

Messi looked to be securing the one major honour missing from his glittering collection in comfort as Argentina cruised into a two-goal

This all changed when an explosive intervention from Mbappe, who scored two goals inside two minutes late on, turned this frantic, magnificent match for the ages on its head.

Messi had given Argentina the lead from the penalty spot in the 23rd minute following Ousmane Dembele's foul on Angel di Maria. It made him the first player in World Cup history to score in the group stage, last 16, quarter-final, semi-final and final of a single tournament.

He then contributed a delicate touch within a magnificent counter-attack that ended with Brighton's Alexis Mac Allister setting up Di Maria for the second 13 minutes later.

Argentina were untroubled until the closing stages, only for Mbappe to give France a lifeline from the penalty spot with nine minutes left then restore equality with a magnificent volley moments later.

Messi bundled Argentina back in front in extra time, but Mbappe completed his treble from the spot two minutes from the end of a frantic, chaotic added spell.

And so it went to penalties, with the two greats opening the scoring. But Argentina and Aston Villa goalkeeper Emiliano Martinez saved from Kingsley Coman, before Aurelian Tchouameni missed, leaving Gonzalo Montiel to win the World Cup.

Messi, a World Cup winner at last, collapsed to his knees in the centre circle and was engulfed by jubilant Argentina team-mates.

Tearful Messi reaches peak

Argentina closed out time in the World Cup final, only for great rival Mbappe to threaten to knock him off and leave him in despair.

Instead, this World Cup - which will now have Messi's name attached to it forever, along with a final that will rank alongside the greats - gave the iconic Argentine the conclusion he wanted.

Messi was imperious for 80 minutes in his final World Cup game as Argentina exerted complete control over a strangely laboured France, scoring his penalty with ease before contributing crucially to a second goal which was a team











creation of beauty finished off by Di Maria.

And then came Mbappe. And then came France. In an atmosphere of disbelief among the massed ranks of Argentina fans who were starting to celebrate victory, Lionel Scaloni's team had to lift themselves once more from the double blow

Inevitably it was Messi who gave them hope again, showing he was happy to do the dirty work by turning home a scrambled finish in the box in the second period of extra time - only for Mbappe to answer again.

But Argentina prevailed on penalties and Messi was the centre of attention when Montiel sent the decisive penalty past France keeper Hugo

Amid wild scenes of celebration, Messi fell to his knees in tears and raised his arms to the skies, before disappearing beneath a mountain of











Messi then took to the microphone to address Argentina's jubilant fans, his Holy Grail reached, another piece of evidence assembled in the argument that would have many declare him the game's greatest player.

Mbappe the history-maker in defeat

Mbappe cemented his status as one of the game's modern greats with only the second hat-trick in a World Cup final, following Sir Geoff Hurst's when England beat West Germany in 1966. But the 23-year-old still suffered the pain of defeat. Mbappe was as anonymous as most of his team for the first 80 minutes, ill-served amid an unfathomably poor France display - which they put in despite seeking to become the first side to retain the trophy since Brazil did so 60 years ago, and only the third ever after Italy won in 1934 and 1938.



Manager Didier Deschamps even made two substitutions before half-time, replacing Olivier Giroud and Dembele with Marcus Thuram and Randal Kolo Muani.

And yet it was Mbappe who revived France in those sensational seconds when they went from looking like timid losers to potential winners, then getting his third from the spot after Messi had put Argentina back in front.

In a stunning period of extra time during which both sides exchanged chances, France could have





won but for a superb last-gasp save by Martinez with his outstretched boot from Muani.

Instead, Mbappe will find history no consolation





as he was embraced by his team-mates and French President Emmanuel Macron at the end of this enthralling spectacle.

Croatia claim World Cup third place in 2 - 1 win against Morocco

Croatia has ended their World Cup campaign with the pride of claiming third place in a 2-1 win against Morocco, which marked the end of a journey but also promised a bright future.

Croatia, who were runners-up in 2018, prevailed with goals by Josko Gvardiol and Mislav Orsic to end their World Cup on a high as Luka Modric possibly bid farewell to the soccer extravaganza. Croatia beat Brazil in the quarter-finals, but for coach Zlatko Dalic, Saturday's bronze-medal game was the highlight of the tournament.

"In any case, the last match we played. If you remember, I had said if we had lost, it would have been a disaster," Dalic said. He also paid tribute to former Serbia midfielder Sinisa Mihajlovic after his death on Friday.

"It was a difficult, great match. I want to extend my congratulations to Morocco, they put up a great fight until the last minute, despite the fatigue," he said.

"They can be proud, they remind me of us four years ago. We're among the best teams in the world."

Croatia can now look forward to the future with confidence.

"It's the end of a cycle for us, the end of a journey. Tonight's match and the win is the moment of the tournament for us," Dalic said.

"Yes this is the last World Cup for some of my players today due to their age.

"But we have young players in the team and it is great for Croatia.

"We would not have been that far without our older players," he said.


"We have a great future, Croatia has nothing to fear. Is it the end of an era for a generation?
